



Permanent Makeup Post Procedure Instructions

Apply ice water on cotton balls to treated area for 10-30 minutes. This helps to reduce swelling and aids in healing.

Some swelling, redness, or itching is normal and to be expected. Apply antibiotic ointment or vasoline sparingly twice a day for seven (7) days until the treated area has healed. Use a clean cotton swab. Do not use your fingertips.

Do not rub or pick at the epithelial crust. Allow it to flake off on its own. Absolutely no scrubbing, cleansing creams or chemicals. Gently cleanse the intradermal cosmetic area with a mild antibacterial soap. You may rinse with water and lightly pat the area dry.

Do not expose the treated area to the sun.

Use a total sun block after the procedure area has healed to prevent future fading of pigment color.

Do not use mascara or eyelash curler for seven (7) days after your procedure. When you resume, purchase a new tube as the old tube may have bacteria in it.

Use sterile dressings and bandages when necessary.

If applicable to your procedure being performed, take your Valtrex prescription as directed.

At the first sign(s) of an infection, adverse reaction or allergic reaction to the procedure, immediately notify Jill Gunton of The Parker Skin & Aesthetic Clinic at 216-464-7333.

Failure to follow post-treatment instructions may cause loss of pigment, discoloration, or infection.

Remember, colors appear brighter and more sharply defined immediately following the procedure. As the healing progresses, color will soften. A touch-up procedure may or may not be necessary. Final results cannot be determined until healing is complete. Touch-up procedures must be made between 30-60 days following the procedure. Additional fees may apply for touch ups. If necessary an appointment for a touch-up will be made.
